Flint Public Library	The purpose of this program is to support the Flint Kids Read initiative by providing free books from Dolly Parton's Imagination Library to children under the age of 5 in Flint homes.	\$150,000
Genesee Intermediate School District	Over two years, the Flint Families Learn program will promote long-term learning and economic success for approximately 40 low-income Flint families each year who have been impacted by the water crisis through two-generational pathways which address school readiness, workforce readiness, and positive parenting that will result in improved parent-child relationships, child and adult literacy, adult education, and employment.	\$84,000
Latinx Flint Hispanic Technology and Community Center	To expand Latinx Flint Technology and Community Center (Latinx Center) 's two (2) - generational literacy opportunities to support children and families addressing learning loss and institutional barriers by providing parent workforce education, Academic Tutoring, and providing opportunities that promote parent-and-child-together time.	\$50,000

Charles Stewart Mott Community College	Delivering Mott Eats will deliver healthy, nutritious food boxes containing vital information on healthy, nutritious recipes, food assistance programs, breastfeeding initiation and maintenance, and activities around healthy food preparation for parents and children to do together to MCC students living in the City of Flint.	\$75,000
Genesee Area Focus Fund, Inc.	YouthQuest, Flint Fresh, and the CrimFit Nutrition Program have come together to ensure Flint kids receive fresh food and produce each month via Farmers Choice Boxes and local growers, with garden-based lesson plans and fresh, locally-grown food products.	\$75,000
